September 2021 Pastor's Letter

Dear friends,

I look back on my letter for August and where we are today regarding the reports of the Covid-19 virus particularly the Delta variant, I just want to be clear, I do not claim to be a prophet especially a prophet of doom! There are enough of those in the Bible and today! It seems that the perseverance I spoke of is going to be something we are all going to need!

This Sunday's (August 29) scripture is from James 1:22-27 where the author writes about being "doers of the word." He goes on in this short letter to also talk about faith and deeds. As I interpret this in the context of today, the author is saying, it is not enough to claim that I have faith that this pandemic will pass and not make any efforts myself. The author implies that faith will result in action. What's Happening Now?

The Rev. Gordon Rankin, Conference Minister for the NH United Church of Christ, has recently issued new recommendations regarding in-person worship during the Covid-19 pandemic. We are in the midst of another surge of infections fueled by the highly contagious Delta-variant. Since August 10th, active cases in Belknap County have almost quadrupled, and Laconia has seen its active case numbers increase about five-fold. Test positivity rates are around 6% locally. Community transmission is considered substantial or high, depending on the data tracker you consult.


Because of this, the Conference is urging us to consider discontinuing indoor in-person worship again.

FOR THE TIME BEING, we are choosing to *continue worship* as we have most recently been experiencing it. We will meet **indoors** with **face masks** and **social distancing**. Coffee Hour will be outdoors weather-permitting. Live-stream worship will be available for any who feel more comfortable worshiping in that way.

The Reopening Team will continue to monitor the data and our compliance with face mask and social distancing guidelines. We have been blessed with the miracle of effective vaccines. Thanks be to God! Let us pray that the people of Laconia, New Hampshire, our country, and our world take advantage of this blessing for the sake of children and vulnerable adults who cannot be immunized and to put an end to this scourge at last. Guide us, o thou great Jehovah!

Service of Hope and Remembrance

From March 22, 2020 through June 6, 2021, the Congregational Church of Laconia-UCC was closed for indoor worship due to the Covid-19 pandemic. None of us could have predicted that our closure would last so long. During those months of isolation, livestream worship, and Zoom meetings, much changed. Among the most profound of these changes was the passing of nineteen souls who were members of our church. Those nineteen were called home at a time when we could not gather as a church family to grieve our losses and celebrate their lives.

So, as part of the Sunday worship service on September 26th, a **Service of Hope and Remembrance** will be offered by Pastor Neil, Diaconate, and the Worship & Music Committee specifically honoring the lives of these nineteen souls and acknowledging any other losses you may have experienced during this time of apartness.
