Tower Tidings Pastor's Article

Janus the Roman god for which the month of January is named is often thought of as a god with two faces one to look forward and another to look back. But more accurately Janus was the god of gateways and doorways, the god of transitions, of beginnings and endings. It comes from the Latin word *lanus* which means arched passage or doorway.

I know that many of us are sincerely hoping for 2022 to be a better year than the past two have been at least from the perspective of the pandemic. But to be honest it looks like we may be in for a few tenuous months with the latest variant of Covid rapidly spreading even infecting those who are fully vaccinated with boosters! It seems to me we've been in a two-year transition, and I am ready to be out of this transition and walk through that arched passage into a beginning.

But true to the mythology of Janus as I look forward, I need to also look back, at least enough to see that even as difficult as it might have been at times I wasn't traveling alone. I had Donna at my side, I had friends, I had some very capable leadership in this church, I had sisters and brothers in Christ who kept me in their prayers. Without I would have stumbled and fallen more than I did these past two years!

There is a verse from the prophet Micah that seems to me is the informal motto of our church. You will find it on the back of the blue t-shirts many of our Faith Formation students wear. It is from Micah 6:8 "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" Micah 6:8

Another verse that comes to mind is from Hebrews 12:1 "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us <u>run with perseverance</u> the race that is set before us,..."


I have had many in this "cloud of witnesses" surrounding me this past year
