Interim Notes

(Occasional "Food for Thought" in Less than 350 Words)

A "task" of interim ministry is allowing for natural shifts of congregational leadership to take place. The interim season can be a time when some people increase their leadership efforts to help "bridge the gap," while others want to adopt more of a "wait-and-see" attitude about what the future will bring.

When I was a part of community organizing ventures, the organizers spoke about the "iron clad rule" of organizing: "Never do for someone else what they can do for themselves." This was an important rule because it meant that leadership development was a continuous process, and constituents could not sit back and rely on the organizer to do all the work. From this leadership rule came another: "Replace yourself." As leaders, we were encouraged to identify and recruit new leaders for the organization and then help mentor them.

I like both "rules" for Congregational Church of Laconia. The work of church leaders is not to do all the work by themselves, but instead to encourage a spirit of service by all. Additionally, leaders can always be "replacing" themselves by helping to identify, recruit and mentor new leaders. No one should be indispensable – well except for Jesus. What might this look like?

- If you are in a leadership role, who can you invite to help with the tasks at hand? Recent research shows that people love to help on short term projects or activities (as opposed to serving on a committee for two or three years).
- If you are feeling overwhelmed, overworked, or out of gas have conversations with others about sharing the load. We are in this together. When church leaders burn out they may also "tune-out" from the life of the church. Let's avoid this by pitching in when possible.
- If you are interested in getting more involved, feel free to attend any committee meeting at the church. The weekly worship bulletin usually lists upcoming meetings. Look for other ways to participate as well.

Moderator Moment

In November 2022, an ad hoc Safety Team of Church Council was formed for the purpose of engaging the church community in conversation about the *balance* between safety and welcome in actions taken by the church. Interactive listening sessions were held on February 26th and March 12th, 2023. These sessions were <u>well-attended</u> and resulted in a wide range of opinions being shared. On an ongoing basis, church staff, leadership, and members may bring forward areas of concern for consideration by the Property and Finance Committee. Church members are also encouraged to share their concerns with Council. Decisions made around safety and security will include reflection upon maintaining a balance between safety and welcome.

This Statement of Purpose was recommended by the ad hoc Safety Team and adopted by the Church Council at their April, 2023 meeting:

The Congregational Church of Laconia, United Church of Christ, seeks to create a safe and secure environment for worship where all are welcome. Toward that end, the Property and Finance Committee, in conjunction with staff, leadership, and members, will prioritize and undertake projects based on heightened awareness of potential risks on church property before, during, and after church services, meetings, and events with a goal of minimizing risks through moderate actions. The church desires to be proactive rather than reactive in addressing needs on an ongoing basis in the following realms:

- Buildings and Grounds
- Physical Well-being
- Medical Well-being
- Emergency Evacuation
- Severe Weather Events

Our prayer is that we can minimize risks to our church community and continue to be a place where all are welcome.



If you get Covid, we hope you will contact your doctor ASAP so that you can be treated to prevent a more severe case.

Covid is *not* a cold or the flu. It still kills an average of about 250 people every day in America. As Christians who are charged with loving our neighbors, we pray that each and every one of us will do what we can in this endemic phase of Covid to prevent the continued spread of this disease.
