Prayer of Confession

Holy love, we gather here to participate in this ancient story, to remember the lengths that the authorities were willing to go to in order to silence you. We read the familiar texts, we participate in the familiar rituals, we remember that which we know well.

And we confess that in our familiarity with your story, we can lose sight of the ways in which that story continues to play out in our world. We treat the remembrance of betrayal and desertion as ancient history, rather than as a mirror into the world around us. We neglect to pay attention to the ways in which those who call us to new life and growth, to justice and equity, are still scapegoated, humiliated, and tortured. We do not acknowledge the crucifixions that this world still imposes, in so many ways.

Call us again to stand at the foot of the cross. Call us to the courage of bearing witness to those who are silenced by a world that resists change. Call us to the discipleship that speaks out boldly in the face of injustice and suffering, even when we are as afraid as Peter. Call us to the love that does hard things, even when the cost seems steep.

Renew us in your love, O God of all, that we might pour that love out upon all Creation.

Blessing of the Elements

Holy one, we remember that when the time was right, you sent Jesus to be among us.

Born into this life, seeing your grace revealed in all things, he laughed with those who laughed, and mourned with those who mourned.

Through your love, he healed our brokenness, he welcomed the outcast, he challenged those in power and the structures that kept them there.

And he called us back to your love.

In the power of the Holy Spirit, the Christ laughs and cries, heals and welcomes, challenges and loves, again and again and again.

We have been told that, on the night before he was taken to be tortured to death on a cross, Jesus sat with his disciples, and ate with them, in a meal of remembrance. Jesus took a loaf of bread, asked your blessing upon it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples saying:

"Take this – all of you – and eat it. This is me. My Body. Given for you. Each time you eat it, remember me."

Close to the meal's end, he took a cup filled with wine, asked your blessing upon it, and gave it to his disciples saying:

"Take this – all of you – and drink it. This is me. This is my promise in my life's blood - poured out for you and for the world. Each time you drink it, remember me."

O God of all, we ask your blessing upon this bread and this cup, and upon all of us who renew our covenant with you. Through this meal, may we be one Body in Christ, renewed and blessed in your holy love. Amen.
